Our Mathematics Learning

This half term in Maths, children will: Engage in Mastering number and consolidate their skills with composition of numbers to 10. Recalling addition and subtraction facts easily.

- Fluently add and subtract numbers within 10.
- Addition and subtraction of single- and two-digit numbers.
- Introduction to multiplication.

This half term in science we will be exploring and comparing the differences between things that are living, dead, and things that have never been alive. Children will identify and name a variety of plants and animals in their habitats, including microhabitats; and describe how animals obtain their food from plants and other animals, using the idea of a simple food chain, and identify and name different sources of food.

You could help your child with their Maths learning by:

Promoting reading for just 10 minutes each night and signing their reading record daily. It really does make a difference.

- Helping them to practice their number bonds to 10 every night.
- Practice counting and down in 10s to 100 confidently.
