Developing positive attitudes towards literacy by...

- Exploring a range of fables. Understanding why fables are important and the moral lesson they provide.
- Continue to develop a cursive, fluent and legible handwriting style.
- Continue to use more ambitious vocabulary by considering our word choices.
- Pupils will plan and write a fable which entertains and give a message/ moral.

You could help your child with their English learning by:

- Reading with them every night, discussing what they have read and signing the Reading Record.
- Encouraging children to up-level their language and use more ambitious words.
- Practise spellings from the Y3/4 spelling list and their personalised list at the back of their Reading Record.

The title of our current unit is:

"What are natural disasters?"

In this unit, pupils will be looking at Earth and naming its layers. They will look at maps and atlases and will trace the tectonic plate boundaries on a world map. They will learn that when these plates collide and rub together this causes an earthquake. They will look at the effects of earthquakes around the world and consider the impact of tsunamis.

You could help your child with their geography learning by:

- Researching, through books or the internet, about the geography of the area. Encouraging them to name and locate the continents and oceans on a map of the world.
- Taking them out in the local area to visit geographical landmarks and researching them.
- Researching earthquakes and tsunamis and discussing the impact of these.

Our Mathematics Learning

This term we will be working on:

- Understanding unit fractions and what they represent.

- Adding and subtracting across a ten.
