

St. John's CE Primary School – Sports & PE Grant Expenditure 2018-2019

During the academic year 2018-2019 57% of our Year 5 children could swim 25m due to school investing in a 10-week course of 1-hour swimming lessons. 28% were able to swim 50m or more.

Purchase new sports equipment to support the delivery of the curriculum and replace worn / unsuitable items.	£623.54 (kit) £3662 (equipment) £4285.54 (total)	The school used the stated money to purchase additional team kit – school has worked to increase its presence in a range of sporting events, ensuring more children get the opportunity to play competitive sports.
Specialist curriculum co-ordinators invested in to lead workshops with children and staff. (Bury FC)	£150	Bury FC Community Trust delivered sessions with key children in a bid to increase engagement with sporting activities and to improve attendance. The team worked with children from KS1 and KS2. Children have been encouraged to play co-operative games, which encourage them to work together.
Invest in quality planning tool to aid the planning and preparation of high-quality PE lessons.	£129.00	Staff feel confident in planning PE lessons and so deliver better quality learning for the children. The children's PE and sports skills are built on and developed in line with the National Curriculum and age-related expectations. There is a consistent approach to planning and delivery of sports lessons.
Engaged with a specialist sports development company to continue to drive the raised profile of sports at St. John's	£5760	EduSport have led PE sessions in school one day a week – including a lunch time club and an afterschool club with a range of classes. This has allowed improved opportunities for children to experience alternative sports and activities during the school day. This has also allowed our children to represent the school in competitive sports throughout the borough.

Engaged with a specialist football coach, Anthony Johnson, to raise the profile of football and to have a school football team.	£1080	Anthony Johnson is a well-known football manager who has positively encouraged children in UKS2 to represent the school in competitive football matches. The school now has a football team and won its first match during the summer term.
Payment to join the borough sports competitions	£30	Cost of joining local sports competitions to ensure children have the opportunity to represent the school at a competitive level.
Level 1 skiing lessons for children in Year 4 and Year 5.	£1955	34 children have now passed their level 1 skiing at The Chill FactorE. Sports grant was used to pay for 2 blocks of 6-week courses to ensure children were given access to new sports skills that they might not have otherwise experienced.
Transport to sporting events.	£880	Sports grant has been used to ensure children attend sporting events, including the ski lessons mentioned above and additional swimming lessons.
Cost for a member of staff to attend ski sessions for ½ a day a week	£2,972.82	Ensuring a member of teaching staff attended the ski lessons with the children has also enabled the profile to be raised in school. As a result, a number of parents have continued to take their children for a session at Chill FactorE and a number of other parents have requested the sessions continue next academic year, so their child is able to attend.
Additional Swimming sessions	Remaining £377.64	During the summer term school used part of the sports grant to fund a two-week block of additional swimming lessons to allow more children to pass their 25m badge.
