

Head Lice Advice for Parents

Head Lice: What You Need to Know

Head lice are tiny insects that live on the scalp and hair. They are common among children and are not a sign of poor hygiene.

Once a Week, Take a Peek

Check your child's hair weekly using a fine-toothed detection comb. Look for live lice and eggs (nits), especially behind the ears and at the nape of the neck.

Treat Only If You Find Live Lice

Use a recommended treatment such as wet combing or a non-pesticide lotion. Follow the instructions carefully and repeat treatment as needed.

Complete the Process

Continue checking and combing every few days for at least two weeks to ensure all lice are removed. Inform close contacts so they can check too.

School Attendance

Children do not need to stay off school if they have head lice. Prompt treatment helps prevent spread.
