🌟 **Free Breakfast Club – Starting after Easter:** We're delighted to let you know that our school has been selected to take part in the Government's new Free Breakfast Club Programme. From April, all children in **Reception to Year 6** can join us for a free, healthy breakfast from **8.15am** each morning, helping everyone enjoy a calm and positive start to the school day. You will still be able to pay for a place from **8.00am** for families who need the early drop off and for nursery-aged children. 🦷 **Looking After Our Bodies** It was great to welcome the dentist in to talk to some of our classes about the importance of toothbrushing last term. In the coming months, our Year 4, Year 5 and Year 6 children will be receiving talks from our School Nursing Team about periods, puberty and the changes that happen in their bodies as they grow (e.g. needing to use deodorant etc.). The School Nurses will speak with the girls, while Mr Thomas and Mr Seale will lead the sessions for the boys. We have already shared information with parents about how we teach this part of the curriculum (Personal, Social and Health Education or PSHE) at our Autumn 2 Family Breakfast and during an open meeting for parents last term. If you would like to discuss this further, please do come and see me.

What has been going on in school recently?

We have welcomed a 'Shades' diversity workshop from Diocese of Manchester, Nursery have been hunting all over the school for the Gingerbread Man – or at least it looked that way from the amount of flour they walked through school - and Reception have been using their maths skills to create some great pictures!
